Bowling Champion to Chinchillas – Steamboat Native Does It All

Vi Look and her husband Dale had 1200 chinchillas at one time. So what the heck is a chinchilla? A chinchilla is a rodent slightly larger than a ground squirrel and native to the Andes Mountains in South America. Their pelts are highly prized for their soft texture, and coats made of chinchilla pelts can sell for more than \$15,000.

Vi and her husband Dale started their chinchilla business in 1965. Dale tanned the pelts to sell them, and they also bred the animals. "We paid as much as \$1500 for an ebony chinchilla," said Vi. "Dale really enjoyed the business and knew all the pedigrees of the animals. We went to shows in the winter, and I loved the people we met." Dale also ran his own construction business. Vi phased out of the chinchilla business after Dale passed away in 2000. They had been married 39 years.

Vi was born in Steamboat Springs and attended the Hilton Gulch Schoolhouse from 1st – 8th grades and graduated from Steamboat Springs High School in 1957. She married Jim Rule the very next day and headed to Alaska, where they spent a summer before moving back to Steamboat. Son Mitch was born in 1959. Vi and Jim divorced, and she

married Dale Look a year later. She and Dale had three children: Norm, Jody and Sandy. Vi has eight grandchildren and eight great-grandchildren.


